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Two prominent Singaporean Malay artists explore our streets, landscapes and landmarks in watercolour, and ink and acrylic, to capture the essence and soul of our city.

Maya Gallery warmly presents a heartfelt exhibition of Singapore's prominent Malay artists – Idris Ali & Jeffrey Wandly – with *Soul Vistas: An Introspective Journey Through Our City*, together with Senior Minister of State, Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Ministry of Defence, Dr Maliki Osman as our esteemed Guest of Honour at the prestigious hall of The Fullerton Singapore!

A timely revisit into our city through the eyes of watercolourist Idris Ali and an unconventional approach of the canvas with architect turned artist, Jeffrey Wandly, who has affectionately earned his nickname within the visual arts scene as the *Building Whisperer*. Exploring landmarks, street and landscapes that are filled with heritage, we allow our eyes to follow the interpretation, colours and brush strokes of these two distinctive artists.

While Idris Ali paints fluently in watercolour, a medium that requires patience and understanding of the composition and colour, Jeffrey Wandly has a unique style of fluid paint strokes created by pouring and swirling ink directly from the bottle.

"This documentation of our visual heritage is crucial, even so as a younger generation of Singaporeans bury their heads in technology and race towards modernisation," expresses Ms. Masturah Sha'ari, Co-founder and director of Maya Gallery when asked about the importance of the exhibition.





Idris was briefly taught by the late S. Mahdar and Mas Ali Sabran in the 1960s. Though he started learning to paint with various mediums, it was watercolour that challenged him as well as seduced him. It then became a 55 year journey for him and his brushes. To look through Idris' watercolours over the past five decades is to chart Singapore's changing landscape. Many of his scenes are off the beaten track and would not usually appeal to the average water-colourist painting outdoors. However, these visual documents are crucial in narrating alternative views of Singapore's changing landscape.

Jeffrey's started painting seriously in 2008. Beginning with charcoal, he gradually moved into ink and acrylic on canvas. By that time he was already an accomplished architect and project management and development professional with a deep level of involvement and familiarity with the built environment. Few of his collectors had named him "Building Whisperer" because they connect to the conversations he has with buildings, and they recognise the soul of the buildings through his works. Like Idris, Jeffrey is capturing a visual diary of the past filled with intimate portraits of the energy and vitality of the places we have inhabited. The buildings he paints mark the sense of place, time and heritage in Singapore's collective memory and physical experience.

This duo exhibition at Fullerton aims to not only educate the public regarding the forgotten heritage scenes of Singapore, but also to bring them on a journey of exploring the colourful and exciting world of watercolour, ink and acrylic. This series of heritage-related paintings by the two artists is timely during this period where our visual history is slowly disappearing. Idris Ali and Jeffrey Wandly's works invite you to look, stop and reflect on your surroundings and philosophies of life because to move ahead, one must know where one came from.









JEFFREY WANDLY (b. 1964, Singapore)



Born in Singapore in 1964, Jeffrey Wandly started painting seriously in 2009, capturing historical landmarks in his own distinct style. The creative process usually starts with a 'conversation' with the building on site, before the artist begins painting on the canvas with layers of ink and acrylic. His works have been described to have strokes which are "fluid with bouncing and dancing lines"; not surprisingly, due to his music background since he was young. Jeffrey has exhibited in Singapore, Malaysia, Indonesia, Korea, Hong Kong and Vietnam.

His first solo show, Poetry of the Soul, which made a debut at Artshow Busan in 2014, with Maya Gallery, featured paintings of spiritual monuments in Asia – mosques, churches, temples, puras and stupas. "These buildings share a common architectural feature, of structures 'pointing' to the sky, thus communicating a global language of peace," he says.

For his second solo, Building Whisperer, at the Singapore Contemporary in 2016, Jeffrey explored the spirit of dancing lines in his conversations with historical places, mixing landscapes with abstract fluidity, and sharing the message of universal harmony. He will be presenting his third show, Bisikan Bangunan (Conversations with Buildings), at Art Expo Malaysia 2016.

While not at his canvas, Jeffrey is an architect, project management professional, director of the Wandly Yazid Orkestra, and co-founder of Maya Gallery, which promotes Singapore artists and was awarded Favourite Recommended Art Gallery at the Expat Living Reader Awards in 2015.
